Some gasoline supplies have trickled into the country and the very next news report said that Haiti looked liked it had totally calmed down. Only days later, they were back to burning things all around the country.

Yesterday Frantz sent this photo. It is from Saint-Marc, a very large

city in the center of Haiti's breadbasket. It is both a port city and a farming community hub.

The building on fire is a bank. The money inside is neither good nor bad. The "Love of money", however is what bites most of us.



There is a percentage

of people in Haiti who have responded well to our Bible classes, where we reason with them according to the scriptures. What starts with a love for money changes to a love for God's wisdom. We then happily write home to you saying "Wish you were here!"

<u>Today is not that day</u>. The story of today, the desperate violence, will be remembered as a contrast to God's more peaceful and productive path. More of Haiti will read about this in our Bible study somewhere down the road.

Please pray for that day to come soon.
