

Time to Fly?

Looks like Brian gets his wish to make a trip into Haiti before the end of the year. Three weeks are now scheduled from November 29 - Dec 20, 2020. Frantz will meet up with Brian in Port-au-Prince and they will travel north to Port-de-Paix. Our Bible studies will be held in this region primarily and in Mare Rouge in the zone commonly called Haiti's "Far West".

Should we even fly to Haiti? Questions of covid are not yet settled, although friends who recently went back to Haiti said there is no one restricting travel. It sounds like a go signal to us.

However, violence is perhaps the biggest question. A large public protest is scheduled for November 18th. One missionary friend suggested I take a small plane across the country to reach Port-de-Paix given the amount of robberies in the center of the country. Another friend offered me a "safe place" to stay at his mission (in the middle of the country) and then followed up with saying that half of his mission's property was burnt to the ground. We were not sure what definition of "safe" he was using.

So yes, there are lots of questions about where to go and how to get there. Bus? Fly? Do we go at all? We expect there will be no easy answer. However, praise the Lord, it gets real easy once we get to our destinations. We'll read scriptures and ask folks "What did God just tell us?"

We are expecting 2 extended Bible study seminars and several days to visit with groups we taught in past years. Mare Rouge is an area we have not traveled to ever and we like the sound of that.
