I have no real details about these churches yet. Frantz has been tending to his father who is in bad health. He said he needed to take his father to Port-au-Prince to see another doctor and the violent protests have blocked the way. It has been a few days since he last communicated.

We are grateful for the classes being scheduled and, of course, hopeful that Frantz can navigate the travel to find the medical help his father needs. Your prayers for these things are appreciated.

For those who do not recall, Haiti has been subjected to a lot of political chaos, killings, kidnappings etc. to the point that the evangelical churches declined to host our Bible studies. They appear to have come out of hibernation and let Frantz set the schedule above. We do not know what triggered the pull back or what re-opened the doors, but we are happy to see it. We prefer to walk with the evangelical churches in Haiti, not apart from them.

The chaos of Haiti is ongoing. Normal travel remains a major problem through the center of the country and around the capital city of Port-au-Prince. We believe the scheduled churches are located in the north of Haiti where Frantz has a good chance to travel safely. As we learn more we will share it with you.

For the moment we are simply glad to know church leadership are resuming normal activities and Frantz is eager to walk with them.

As I, Brian, await the opportunity to join Frantz, God has blessed me to speak online with a wide variety of people across the world while teaching English. Far more than you might imagine, the conversations have included religious topics. In the right hand column we included a brief part of one conversation. It highlights the need to be ready in season and out of season. The world is hungry for English but hungrier still for truth.
