The typical effort to gather more members of the church to attend is not successful. Those who have the spirit-driven desire to attend our class responded the first time. Admonishing members to enroll doesn't pay dividends. Students of the first class know they are the chosen workers to bring the rest of the church along slowly.

Simple Invitations

When we do schedule a second seminar at a church, so the church can make a stronger attempt to bring in more students, we invite the students from the first class to participate with us in teaching the second class.

They seldom avail themselves of the opportunity, but teaching alongside us is not as hard as it might sound.

We look at the Bible and presume that it says what God wants us to know.

Then we simply read verses and ask the class, "What did the Bible just say?"

followed closely by...

"How does it agree with what we actually do?"

It's a wonderful time... if we don't get shut down!
