One great way to keep focused on what is most important to God... keep your nose pointed into the Word of God.

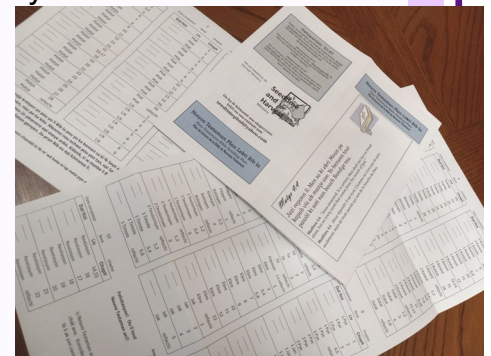

Proverbs 12:15 stood out in her mind. *The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice.* "I learned so much", she said.
